

Event Summary

1:00 PM - We will meet at Rick Hill and go through the housekeeping process (signing waiver's, drivers meeting, etc.) to start rolling shortly after that. We will drive a "crippled" section of the Copperhead Road, probably 1/3 of the entire loop (full loop ride in August).

2:45 PM - We will stop for gas and restroom in Sneedville. Then after driving part of Copperhead Road, we will head back on HWY US-11 to take the scenic Goshen Valley Rd towards Beech Creek Rd, Lone Star Rd, Reservoir Rd (those last 3 you might remember from our drive to Amis Mill in February if you attended the drive).

5:15 PM - We will arrive at the MeadowView Conference Resort & Convention Center, where we will have the chance to watch the Kingsport Boys & Girls Club Porsche Macan Raffle draw (many members of the club bought a ticket, hopefully one of us will win). We will also have the outdoor patio with the fire pit and indoor seating to use while we eat and drink.

For over 14 year, the Kingsport Boys and Girls Club have been raffling a Porsche (thanks for supporting the most perfect car's brand) and the chances of winning a so good (only 1,300 tickets are sold) that the winners of 2017 and 2018 are people that I know in person. If you are interested in buying a ticket, head to kbcg.org (winner doesn't have to be present to win). KBGC is a non-profit org and their mission is to inspire and enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens.

Route details:


- Departure: Rick Hill Porsche – Left on US-11W – Drive 30.1 miles
- After 30.1 miles on US-11W, turn right onto TN-66 N
- Stay on TN-66 N for 24 miles
- Turn right on JCT 33 / TN-66 N at the Hancock Co Veterans Bridge
- Turn left at BP Gas Station (Restroom backup plan: Hardee's at 1104 Main St, Sneedville)
- Continue onto Jimmie Roberts Rd (across BP/parallel to the river) for 5 miles and merge into TN-33
- Stay on TN-33 N until Kyles Ford for 6 miles
- Turn right to continue onto TN-70 S and drive 16.7 miles
- Follow the signs to US-11 N (go under US-11, first left to Main St and first left to US-11N)
- Once on US-11N, drive 16 miles and turn right on Goshen Valley Rd in Church Hill area (watch for the Laurel Run Park sign before the bridge and turn right after the bridge)
- Stay on Goshen Valley Rd for 13 miles and turn left at the stop sign
- That's the TN-347 E, which will have multiple road names (Grassy Branch, Beech Creek, N Fork, Lone Star, Reservoir) – Stay there for 20 miles – it is almost a straight (sort of)





If you look closer, the first section of the drive goes through some nice sets of twists and mountains:



COVID-19 RULES

Wilderness Trail Region is ruled by Porsche Club of America, aka PCA National. In order to have authorization to this event and an insurance certificate issued, the following rules are applied to this event:

- 1) You will have to **sign** the COMMUNICABLE DISEASE EXPOSURE AND INFECTION ASSUMPTION OF RISK, HOLD HARMLESS, RELEASE, WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT.

We will have copies to you to sign, but if you want to make this event as contactless as possible to you, bring your own copy signed (must print with colors). Here is a link to read it in advance, or print the form if you want to bring your own copy:

- 2) You will have to sign the regular waiver that you used sign on every PCA moving event and you can't bring your own copy signed as this has to be signed in presence of a witness. Bring your own pen if you want to make it as contactless as possible to you and we will bring the form printed to you to sign.

Here is what in PCA's guidelines:

In all things PCA does, first and foremost is the health and safety of our members, employees, sponsors and communities. Federal, State/Provincial and Local guidelines and restrictions supersede these guidelines where there is conflict or ambiguity.

Take Steps to Protect Yourself and Others:

- Stay home when you are sick.
- Stay home if you have been in contact with someone in the last two weeks who has been sick.
- Bring your own personal protective equipment (PPE), including masks, gloves, hand sanitizer and disinfectant.
- Practice social distancing of at least 6 feet between non-cohabitating attendees.

- Wear your face mask when in the presence of others.
- Physical contact is discouraged. Refrain from shaking hands, fist-bumps and hugs.
- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially before eating and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Refrain from touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue into the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Use best judgement and common sense regarding your fellow members' good health. Region Leadership including the Event Chair have the authority to require you to leave if you cannot comply with these community protection measures.

Note that, the use of face mask is "*encouraged*" but not mandatory by PCA. You must observe any local, state or federal law regard the use of face mask.

We, the organizers, will be taking other precautions to make this event safe to everyone.
